Please make plans to join us for any and/or all events. The more we participate and are informed, the better we can serve our veterans and families.

Auxiliary Presidents: By now, you should have appointed your VFW Auxiliary Chairman and sent your program form to Nancy Chester, Department Secretary. Those forms were previously distributed to the Auxiliary President, but for your convenience, a second copy of that form is included in this GO. From the Department GO’s ask your Auxiliary Secretary to distribute the Program Bulletins to the Auxiliary Chairmen. The Department Chairman Program Bulletins contain this year’s program goals, progress on the goals, and valuable information and suggestions for your monthly Auxiliary meetings and programs.

Auxiliary Presidents and Treasurers: Your Auxiliary needs to be bonded by September 15, 2016. Please do so ASAP. By September 1st if an Auxiliary is not bonded, I will need to commence the procedure to put the Auxiliary on suspension, and I don’t want to have to do that. It’s a very simple procedure which only takes a few minutes to do online. If you need assistance, do not hesitate to contact me or Dept. Treasurer Carol Gross. Also, Auxiliary officers of President, Secretary and Treasurer need to have their dues paid. Please make sure your Auxiliary is in compliance. Department Officers, you too need to have your dues paid. Thanks to all of you.

District Presidents are reminded that Annual Inspections are very important and must be conducted. Each District President received an Inspection form in their binder at the State Convention. The Inspecting Official should sign the Secretary’s and Treasurer’s book only if they are kept according to procedure outlines in the Booklet of Instruction. If not, that should be noted on the inspection form. Every question on the Inspection Form should be answered. Inspection Forms should be filled out in triplicate with the signatures of the Inspecting Officer and Auxiliary President on each copy. One copy for Auxiliary records, one copy for District President, and one copy forwarded to Department President. If any Auxiliary is struggling, please note it on the Inspection form. The sooner we can offer assistance to these Auxiliaries, the better. The National Program Books for each Auxiliary that you received at the

State Convention should be distributed by now. Any future information you receive at the Retreat or Fall Council needs to be distributed immediately to Auxiliaries absent from these events.

Membership – dues notices have been sent to all continuous members. As of August 5, 2016, SD's membership is at 71.99%. Remember our ultimate goal is 100% plus one to receive a \$1,000 award for the Department. We have quarterly goals also, which if met will mean an additional \$1,450 in award monies for the Department. All of these are very, very important to our Auxiliaries and the Department. Our first-quarter goal is for 50 NEW (which includes new life members) and REJOIN members by October 31, 2016, for an award of \$200. Do you have all your eligible family members signed up? Ask, ask, ask – many members say they would have joined earlier if only they had been asked. Keep in contact with your VFW, and if the VFW gets a new member, see how many eligible family members there are for the Auxiliary.

Forfeiture/Cancellation of Auxiliary Charters -- I regret to inform the membership the Mobridge 2741 has forfeited its Charter and Turner 2821 at Parker, Wilde 3728 at Freeman, and Clayton Van Houten 1640 at Hot Springs have had their Charters canceled. We need to reach out to members of those Auxiliaries and invite them to transfer membership to another Auxiliary. We also need to be more diligent in recognizing Auxiliaries that need a helping hand and reach out to them before a forfeiture or cancelation happens.

Distribution of General Orders – please note that pursuant to the Standing Rules, only one (1) printed copy of the General Orders will be mailed to each Auxiliary President for distribution within the Auxiliary only by request or request by email only. That request should be submitted by the Auxiliary President. As a courtesy, we will also be sending printed copies to Past Department Presidents that do not have internet or computer access. When distributing items contained in the General Orders, you need not necessarily make "hard copies." It is suggested that you forward the information via email to those that you can. Also remember that the General Orders will be posted on the SD VFW website (sdvfw.org). There is no intent to exclude anyone, but we need to be more efficient and cost effective.


The building will be open at 8:00am each day and will close at 8:00 pm. Come and enjoy the State Fair, we hope to see you there.

Since we are given such short notice it’s advised you make your ornaments now. They can always be used at your post, courthouse, or a local business if we are not selected.



This year’s theme is "A Monumental Christmas". Groups are asked to decorate with this theme in mind, and monumental is described as meaning impressively large & enduring, of outstanding significance, exceptionally great, big, important, & unforgettable. Asking, “What makes Christmas monumental?”

The answer is simple. Our Veterans make Christmas monumental. These heroes don’t wear capes... they wear dog tags!

Use template (left) & print off on heavy paper or card stock.

Place your beloved Veteran’s photo on the larger side, their name, branch of military, etc., on the other. (Sample, right)

They will be hung on the tree with a small piece of chain, so remember to place the photo to accommodate this. Any chains you can contribute would be appreciated.

My name is Nancy Worth and most of you know me as the Immediate Past Department President. Throughout my years of involvement with the VFW Auxiliary, I have promoted membership and many other programs that benefit our members and veterans. Now I am promoting the National Certified Recruiter Trainer Program (NCRT).

I am replacing Jan Endes, Past Department President and member of Winner Auxiliary #4674. Jan was one of the very first VFW Auxiliary NCRT when the program began in 2014. She served us well, but has moved on to other duties within our Department.

What is a National Certified Recruiter Trainer (NCRT)? A NCRT is a person appointed by National Headquarters and accountable to the National Secretary-Treasurer and the Director for Programs and Communications. Our program mission is to positively promote the VFW Auxiliary by teaching members how to successfully recruit new members, as well as how to retain current members, so that the VFW Auxiliary can increase its membership and continue to serve veterans for years to come. The NCRT program is designed to support the Membership program in each Department; it will not take its place.

Why do we need this program? The VFW Auxiliary has many wonderful programs and offers many opportunities to our members. However, we are losing more members than are joining and we must take steps to turn this around as soon as possible.

What can we do? We must look at ways we can attract prospective members, retain our current members and try to invite back members who have left our Auxiliary.

How can we do this? Hopefully everyone will take the time to attend one of my training sessions. I hope to hold a training session in every District during the upcoming year as well as at our Department Conferences. A class is scheduled for our up-coming SD VFW Auxiliary Member Retreat, August 18-21, 2016 at The Roost in Grenville, SD; a training session will also be included September 24th beginning at 8:00am). I will also be including periodic messages with "Helpful Hints" in the Department General Orders.

Is this program important to the VFW Auxiliary? It most certainly is! The survival of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary is at stake. We can now admit eligible males to our organization and I have some great ideas to help boost all South Dakota Auxiliary membership numbers. Here is how you can help:


How many of our schools utilize the VFW for posting the colors during sporting events? We have our VFW post the colors for our Wrestling tournament each year. This past year it was a very moving

Before I start my report, Ken and Michelle, Paul and I would like to thank you for the outstanding support on the loss of my mother. We were amazed at the number of cards we received. No, we didn't get to Virginia as planned . . .

To report on project, Burrito Pillowcases, YES, they can go to any Veteran. You certainly may deliver them yourselves whenever it works for you. Just keep track and let me know so that I can report it. We were amazed at how many kits were purchased. For those of you not at the State Convention, we are making pillowcases for all Veterans. Please do them in patriotic colors. We plan to deliver them to the Veterans at Fort Meade, Hot Springs, Sioux Falls, and Yankton.

Did you realize that the VFW Auxiliary members have volunteered nearly 800,000 hours annually and that one in eight members volunteer through the Hospital Program. We are working to meet the needs of hospitalized veterans in VA Medical Centers and other medical facilities since 1914.

Remember that we promote Veteran and Military Suicide Awareness as one of our goals. Each day, an estimated 22 veterans commit suicide. You can help lower this number and make a difference in the life of a veteran or service member in crisis by educating yourself and others about the warning signs of suicide:

1 -The Veteran & Military Suicide Awareness Blue Teardrop Sticker is the VFW Auxiliary's symbol to give this issue the attention it so desperately needs. Wear the teardrop to open a conversation; when asked what the teardrop is, share that it's to create awareness for veteran and military suicide.

2 -The Veterans Crisis Line connects veterans in crisis and their families and friends with qualified, caring Department of Veterans Affairs responders through a confidential toll-free hotline, online chat, or text. Veterans and their loved ones can call 1-800-273-8255 and Press 1, chat online, or send a text message to 838255 to receive confidential support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Support for deaf and hard of hearing individuals is available.

Burrito Pillowcase

Materials required for standard size pillowcase:

Each pillowcase takes a total of 1 yard of fabric – suggest contracting fabrics, so 1 yard of 3 fabrics will make 3 pillowcase. Backstitch all seams. Since we are doing these for Veterans, please use a combination of red, white and blue of any shade.

A = Accent (2” the width of the fabric, folded and pressed matching cut edges to wrong sides together)

B = Cuff (9” the width of the fabric)

C = Body (25 inches the width of fabric)

Instructions:

1. Lay B out flat (right side up), lay A on top of B matching upper cut edges, lay C (right side down) on top of B matching upper cut edges. Pin the three pieces together.
2. Fan-fold the remaining fabric of C until the lower half of B is visible, fold lower cut edge of B up and over the fan-folded fabric of C. Remove prior pins and re-pin all 5 cut edges together. Stitch across the width of fabric with a $\frac{1}{4}$ seam allowance.
3. 3. The product now looks like a burrito. From one end, pull on C folding back B until C is completely pulled out. Press the cuff away from the body on both sides. The accent will be toward the body. This may be sewn down, your choice.
4. Fold project in half (wrong sides together) with the pillowcase cuff edges together. Stitch side and bottom using $\frac{1}{4}$ ” seam. {In other words, a French seam}
5. Turn inside out with the right sides of the fabric together. Stitch the seams, again using a $\frac{1}{2}$ ” seam allowance.

If you skip step 4, you will have to zig-zag your seam.

6. Turn and Press

HAVE A PLAN

Every Department and Auxiliary should have a Membership Plan. This plan should include:

- * Recruiting events for new members

Before a membership year begins, set your calendar for when you plan to each of these. Make it as easy as possible for them to renew their dues. Plan at least four recruiting events in your community each year.

FOLLOW UP!

Most likely, first time you talk to someone new about the organization, that person will not be ready to commit. It's important to ask for their contact information and then follow up within a week.

I’m enclosing information on the Patriot’s Pen Essay and the Voice of Democracy Essay. Please get the word out as soon as possible. Print off the pamphlets and put some in the library, Dr. Office, hang them on bulletin boards in businesses (after asking permission), and in your local newspaper. Most importantly, take them to your school.

Patriot’s Pen theme is “The America I Believe In”. Those eligible are students in grades 6-8 who is enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the US and its territories. The first-place winner from each state competes for national awards totaling \$50,000, with each first-place state winner receiving a minimum of \$500 at the national level. The national first-place winner wins \$5,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington D.C., in March. Each student writes a 300-400, word essay expressing their views based on a patriotic theme chosen by the VFW Commander-in-Chief. November 1 is the deadline for the student to get their entry to the VFW Post. November 15, is the District deadline, and Dec. 15 is the VFW Department Judging deadline.

Voice of Democracy theme is “My Responsibility to America”. Students in grades 9-12 record their essay to an audio CD or flash drive. These students have to be enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the US. The recording can be no shorter than three minutes and no longer than five minutes (plus or minus five seconds). Once a student has completed their audio version, they submit their typed version, CD/flash drive and the VOD entry form to their local VFW Post by the November 1 deadline. The deadline for the District judging is November 15, and the Department judging is January 10. The national first-place winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient’s American university, college or vocational/technical school. Other national scholarships range from \$1,000-\$16,000 and the first-place winner from each Department wins a minimum scholarship of \$1,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest: This is open to all students, including home-schooled students in grades 9-12. No digital art will be accepted and artwork must be on canvas or paper. It will be judged on patriotic theme and technique. Deadlines for the entries are: March 31 to the local Auxiliary, and April 15 to the Department. National 1st. place winner will receive \$10,000. For more details and requirements go to www.vfwauxiliary.org.

Continuing Education Scholarship: This scholarship is open to any Auxiliary member ‘s (who has belonged for at least a year), spouse, son, or daughter with a financial need. Entrant must be at least 18 years old, complete the application and submit an essay of 300 words or less. The application must be received at National Headquarters by February 15, or email it to info@vfwauxiliary.org. A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to an applicant in each of the four Conferences. Eligibility Requirements

The VFW Auxiliary is pleased to present scholarships to assist members and their immediate family members who wish to further their education by pursuing a college degree or career direction at a vocational/technical school.

Four \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded each year, one in each of the four VFW Auxiliary Conferences.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the American college or vocational/technical school of the awardee's choice.

- Applicant must be 18 years of age or older.
- Applicant must be one of the following:
 - Current VFW Auxiliary Member*
 - Spouse of current VFW Auxiliary Member*
 - Son of current VFW Auxiliary Member*
 - Daughter of current VFW Auxiliary Member*

**Qualifying member must have been a member of the VFW Auxiliary for one (1) year by the application submission deadline.*

The Application Process

A completed application must be submitted for each individual seeking a Continuing Education Scholarship from the VFW Auxiliary. Each applicant must:

- Answer all questions on the application.
- Write a brief essay (no more than 300 words) describing their commitment to their goals and how this scholarship will help them attain these goals.

Application Tips

Here are some tips to keep in mind throughout the process:

- Be mindful of the eligibility requirements.
- Answer **ALL** questions on the application.
- Applications are due at VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters no later than February 15. Applications received after February 15 will not be considered.

Application Timeline

WHAT IS PATRIOT'S PEN?

Conducted nationwide, this VFW-sponsored youth essay competition gives students an opportunity to write essays expressing their views on an annual patriotic theme. We invite you to join the more than 120,000 students who participated last year in this contest. The national winners will receive at least \$500. The first-place national award is currently \$5,000 plus an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C. for the winner and a parent or guardian.

The National Association of Secondary School Principals (NAASP) has again approved this contest for its National Advisory List of Contests and Activities.

BIG NATIONAL PRIZES

National awards total: \$54,500

Prizes include the various amounts listed below:

1st: \$5,000	7th: \$1,750
2nd: \$4,000	8-9th: \$1,500
3rd: \$3,500	10-11th: \$1,250
4th: \$2,750	12-22nd: \$1,000
5th: \$2,500	23-24th: \$750
6th: \$2,000	25-54th: \$500

The Internal Revenue Service requires that any recipient that receives more than a \$599 award should receive a Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable.

HOW DOES THE CONTEST WORK?

All entries begin at the Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the local VFW Post competition. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post. This participating Post should be within your local area and within your U.S. state of residence.

The contest consists of four levels. The first level (entry) is sponsored by local VFW Posts. Post winners advance, one for every 15 entries, to the VFW District (regional) level where the one first-place winner is advanced to the VFW Department (state) level. The one first-place winner at the Department level is then advanced into the VFW national competition. The winner from each Department (state) then competes for the national prizes.

WHO CAN ENTER?

Patriot's Pen is open to 6th-, 7th- and 8th-grade students enrolled by the Nov. 1 deadline in public, private or parochial schools in the U.S., its territories or its possessions. Home-schooled students also are eligible. Although U. S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U. S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. (Foreign exchange students and former winners that placed in the National contest are excluded from the contest.)

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

- Ask a teacher or youth group/club adult leader to supervise the Patriot's Pen writing competition.
- Contact a local VFW Post within your local area within your state and indicate your interest in participating.
- Establish a contact person who is a member of that VFW Post or its VFW Auxiliary.
- Make sure that your essay is submitted to the VFW Post before the contest deadline of Nov. 1, 2016. You can submit your essay and entry form electronically (by email) upon the Post's approval.

HOW AM I JUDGED?

You will be judged on how well you understand, develop and present the theme. A positive approach is recommended to express your viewpoint.

Knowledge of the theme is worth 30 points:

You must show a thorough knowledge of the theme in your work. Demonstrate you have researched the issue extensively.

Theme development is worth 35 points:

Answer all relevant facts about the theme such as the who, what, where, when and why. Relate the theme to your own experiences.

Clarity of ideas is worth 35 points:

Write your essay in an easy-to-understand format. Leave your reader with a clear understanding of your explanation of the theme.

WHAT IS THE THEME?

VFW's Commander-in-Chief annually chooses the year's theme. The 2016-17 theme is **The America I Believe In.**

WHAT ARE THE RULES?

- Essay length: 300-400 typewritten words.
- You must write your own essay.
- All essays should be typed in English with no color or graphics and cannot be less than 300 words or greater than 400 words in length. (Essays under or over these word amounts will be eliminated.) Every word is counted regardless of length. The essay title (theme) or added footnotes do not contribute to the word count. At any time during the contest additional participant personal information (i.e. SSN, photo, etc.) could be requested by the VFW.

In no way may contestants identify themselves within their essay (including, but not limited to, your name, school, city, state, race or national origin.) Do not put your name on your essay. The entry form is your essay's cover sheet. Secure the Official Student Entry Form with a staple or other fastener on

top of your essay. Contestants are allowed to enter only once each year if otherwise eligible (one Post competition). Contestants found in violation of this rule will face elimination from the competition and will be required to return any and all prize money awarded or received.

The essay must be a contestant's original work and a product of the contestant's own thinking. The approach to the Patriot's Pen theme should be positive and clearly focused. Poetry is not acceptable. Quotations may be used sparingly if plainly identified wherever used. A contestant's teacher, counselor or parent may check the essay for punctuation, grammar and/or spelling, but the content must remain the contestant's. Contestants will be judged on the basis of their essay alone and are not required to present the essay orally. All essays become the property of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. The VFW retains non-exclusive rights to use your essay and likeness in the promotion and execution of the organization's programs and activities.

DEADLINE INFORMATION

To qualify, all entries must be submitted to a sponsoring local VFW Post by midnight November 1, 2016.



WHAT IS THE VOICE OF DEMOCRACY PROGRAM?

Since 1947, the Voice of Democracy has been the Veterans of Foreign Wars' (VFW's) premier scholarship program. Each year, almost 40,000 high school students compete for more than \$2 million in scholarships and incentives. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's theme is, *My Responsibility To America*.

WHY SHOULD I ENTER?

Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, state and national level. Department (State) winners receive an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C., Feb. 25 - March 1, 2017, to tour the city, be honored by the VFW and its VFW Auxiliary and receive their portion of \$153,000 in national awards, the top scholarship being \$30,000.

THE RULES

Who can enter?

The Voice of Democracy is open to students in grades 9-12 by the Nov. 1 deadline, who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign exchange students, students age 20 or over, previous Voice of Democracy first place state winners, GED or Adult Education Students are ineligible.

What do I need to enter?

Record your original 3-5 minute (+ or - 5 seconds max.) essay on an audio CD or a flash drive. One student per CD or flash drive. When burning your CD, make sure that "Create Audio CD" option (or similar) is selected so the program can properly convert your sound file and burn it to CD. After it has finished, be sure to play back your audio CD on a system other than your computer, such as a standard radio or car CD player, to verify that the conversion/burning process was successful. You will submit the recording, typed essay and this completed entry form. Provide these items to your school/group competition or local VFW Post for judging. In addition you can submit your emailed entry form, essay, and audio file to the VFW Post upon approval. You must be the sole author of your essay. The recording must be in your own voice and in English. Hearing/speech impaired students should email the Voice of Democracy National Office at kharmer@vfw.org for special instructions. No music, singing, poetry or sound effects are allowed. The body of the essay must not identify you in any way, (including, but not limited to your name, school, city, state, race, or national origin) although the recording & typed essay should be labeled with your name, to show ownership. You may enter only one competition at one Post (if otherwise eligible) per year. At any time during the contest, additional participant personal information could be requested by the VFW, including but not limited to a photograph, SSN, or biographical information.

WHERE DO I SUBMIT MY ENTRY?

All entries begin at the local VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the local VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post. This VFW Post should be within your local area and within your U.S. state of residence. One winner for every 15 entries from each Post advances to District and one District winner advances to the state (Department) competition. State winners are invited to Washington, D.C. where their audio essays compete in the finals competition. WHAT IS THE DEADLINE FOR MY ENTRY?

All entries competing at the Post level must be in the hands of that VFW Post by midnight, **Nov. 1, 2016**. It is the responsibility of the student to meet this deadline by submitting their entry to the proper location by ensuring it is a participating Post.

WHAT ARE THE JUDGING CRITERIA?

Originality is worth 30 points:

Treatment of the theme should show imagination and human interest.

Content is worth 35 points:

Clearly express your ideas in an organized manner. Fully develop your theme and use transitions to move smoothly from one idea to another.

Delivery is worth 35 points:

Speak in a clear and credible manner.

Contest Rules

Art must be on paper or canvas. Water color, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen-and-ink, or oil may be used. **Digital art and photography are not accepted.**

Do not frame! Submit canvas entries on stretcher frames or canvas board. **Other entries must be matted on white.** Do not use other color mats. In matting, **use heavy paper to reinforce back.** Mounted and floating mats may also be used. The art should be no smaller than 8" x 10" but no larger than 18" x 24", not including mat.

- Be sure to complete entry form and attach to back of entry.
- Note that you must be sponsored by a VFW Auxiliary
- Entry may be signed by the student

Package art so that it can be mailed without being damaged.

If you use the American Flag in your entry, it must conform to the Federal Flag Code as far as color, number of stars and stripes, and other pertinent rules of the code.

Entry must have been done during the current school year—note that you must have your teacher's or supervisory adult's signature. Each student may submit only one entry.

Each entry will be judged on the originality of concept, presentation, and patriotism expressed; the content of how it relates to patriotism and clarity of ideas; the design technique; total impact of work; and uniqueness.

Eligibility

Students must be in grades 9, 10, 11 or 12. Students must attend school in the same state as the sponsoring VFW Auxiliary. Home-schooled students are eligible; foreign-exchange students are not. Students must be a maximum of 18 years of age at the time of local entry, and they must be a U.S. citizen or U.S. national.

National winners of the past contests may not compete in future Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contests.

District Judging
(Optional) If held, the District winners must meet the Department deadline for judging.

Department Judging
VFW Auxiliary or District entries must be received by the Department Scholarships Chairman by April 15!

National Deadline
Department entries in the National Contest must be received at VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters, 406 West 34th Street, 10th floor, Kansas City, Missouri 64111 **by May 5! Only the first-place Department winner is eligible for the national competition. The Department winners will be judged at the National Convention.**


Judges


