In Memorium - Past State Commander Dennis Sharp



In memory of Past All American (2016-2017) State Commander Dennis Sharp. Dennis passed away peacefully September 29, 2018 after a hard fought battle with ALS. Dennis joined the Veterans of Foreign Wars in 1992. He spent the next 26 years giving dedicated service to all veterans. He was especially proud to serve on the Honor Guard for his comrades, and also took great pride in posting the American flag at Veterans and Memorial Day services. In 2012, Dennis was elected State Surgeon for the Department of SD, thus starting his line officer venture culminating in his election as SD VFW Commander in Chief for 2016 and 2017. Dennis earned All American Commander status, one of thirteen worldwide, during his tenure.

In the fall of 1964, Dennis enlisted and entered the Navy in June 1966, and served until February 1970. He enjoyed his service tour sailing around two-thirds of the world and serving a year in DeNang VietNam.

Dennis was a life member of Veterans of Foreign Wars, a VFW Gold Legacy member, life member of VFW National Home for Children, life member of DAV, member of American Legion and member of Lutheran Memorial Church.

Women Forge New Roles

Today’s wars see more and more females taking up arms against the enemy. Making up 15% of active-duty forces, service women of today are changing the way society has traditionally viewed females in war.

Persian Gulf War sees largest deployment of women yet. Female personnel took on important roles during the 1991 campaign in Kuwait and Iraq. Since the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq first began, there have been many firsts for women. Women continue to break new ground in Iraq and Afghanistan: Over 220 thousand have served there. Suddenly, females were thrust into key combat support positions.

Throughout American history, women have been quick to put on a uniform in defense of the nation. Without the service and sacrifice of women throughout the history of our country, female service members likely would not be where they are today. More of those firsts seem like a distant memory today, said one female member of the VFW Post, because things are changing fast for women in the organization.

August 23, 1978 was a landmark day for women veterans in VFW. That is when delegates to the 89th National Convention, adopted a resolution admitting women to the organization. The wars in Iraq and Afghanistan have left more women eligible to join the VFW. With this expanded eligibility has come increased influence of women in leadership positions at all levels, as well as a boost in the number of women active in the organization as a whole. Soon there will be more women holding offices at the national level, working side-by-side with their male counterparts, as they did serving in the military.

Female impressions of the VFW have changed dramatically. It is more typical, that they really serve the community. And, that there is a certain bond among veterans of foreign wars, especially now that the new wars occurred and brought in a lot more young people, and especially a lot more females.

Recruiting more females is currently a big push in the VFW. For now, women are enjoying playing a larger VFW role. “No matter what uniform you wore, we all end up standing together.” To show younger members that it’s not just the old boys that are running things any more. Many women say their VFW experience has been satisfying.

As members, women share the same types of experiences as the male counterparts; the comradeship is wanted or maybe even needed for everybody. Women have a lot to offer at any level of the VFW...women need to step up to the plate and continue their service as VFW members. “Women just as men, join for the benefits and camaraderie.” Just as the military was once considered a man’s world, VFW was the same way for years.

With the military seeing a larger percentage of women going into combat, we need the educate the public that VFW is no longer just a bunch of men. “VFW can provide guidance for those who are unaware of his or her entitlements as a veteran.” There is no greater feeling than being around people who have similar experiences and have a mutual understanding and respect for one another.

VFW at a Glance

Origins: In 1899, the American Veterans of Foreign Service (Columbus, Ohio) and the National Society of the Army of the Philippines (Denver, Colo.) were organized to secure rights and benefits for veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippines War (1899-1902). These two organizations merged in 1914, creating the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. VFW was chartered by Congress in 1936.

Membership Eligibility: Those serving honorably in the U.S. Armed Forces in a foreign war or overseas operation recognized by a campaign medal, in Korea after June 30, 1949, and recipients of hostile-fire or imminent danger pay. Veterans of World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, Persian Gulf, Somalia, Kosovo, Afghanistan, Iraq and other smaller expeditionary campaigns, as well as occupation duty, qualify.

The Sioux Falls VA Health Care System is pleased to provide complete primary care for women Veterans that includes services for acute and chronic illnesses, preventive services, gender-specific care, maternity and newborn care, coordination of care, and other specialty services such as care for military sexual trauma, mental health concerns, whole health, integrative health.

Did you know that women make up 9.6 percent of the total Veteran population (source: VA's Center for Women Veterans)? By 2020, women are expected to reach 10.5 percent of the total number of Veterans in the U.S. Since 9/11, nearly 350,000 women have deployed in support of military operations. Those numbers are higher than they have ever been — a sign of the increasing diversity in the United States armed forces.

Among Veterans, women are younger, more ethnically diverse, and


This month we have change in direction and mental health month. Listen I want to tell you that until we end 22 a day,



Dear Comrades, Brothers and Sisters,

The fall season is upon us. It's a time of holidays. There will be many gatherings for everyone to plan for or attend. May it be a safe season as well as a joyous season for all of us.

My favorite holiday is Thanksgiving. As Paul writes down for us; Thessalonians 5:16-18¹⁶ Rejoice evermore.¹⁷ Pray without ceasing,¹⁸ In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you. I love that, *'in everything'*, Give Thanks. This is in good times and bad times, we are to be thankful.

Long lines at stores for check out, or over the hot stove cooking, or washing the pots and pans later, or spilt gravy or worse human adversity, should not take away the joy or the thankfulness. Everyday is a give thanks day no matter what. It seems we just make it official in the fall during a certain time.

I was stationed in Belgium in 1987. Chaplain Bill Thompson walked up to me and said, "I need a favor". He handed me a numerical Bible verse. I had to go look it up later. He was putting together a little book program of what Christmas and Thanksgiving meant to us, for those stationed at this remote tour. more likely to have served in the Gulf War era or peacetime. Women are the fastest-growing Veteran subpopulation.

The total population of women Veterans is expected to increase at an average rate of about 18,000 women per year for the next 10 years. Women Veterans currently are and will continue to be an important part of the Veteran community and an important part of VA.

The total population of women Veterans in South Dakota as of 9/30/2017 was 6515. (Source: National Center of Enterprise Integration, National Center for Veterans Analysis and Statistics, VA Veteran Population Projection Model 2016).

At the Sioux Falls VA Medical Center there is a dedicated women's health clinic with a separate waiting room.

Just get 'ER Done!

Autumn is here, and harvest is just around the corner! These fall days are a great time to complete those cleaning tasks you have been putting off. As a veteran, it's also a great time to review your chore list.

- Locate your discharge papers. These papers are needed to verify military service for healthcare benefits, retirement, employment, education benefits and burial benefits.
- Record your discharge papers with the local county register of deeds. It costs nothing, and they are then on file for you or your family to retrieve when needed.
- Locate and visit your local county or tribal veterans service officer (<https://vetaffairs.sd.gov/veteransserviceofficers/locatevso.aspx>) or our claims office (2501 W. 22nd Street) in Sioux Falls. Benefits and services are ever-changing. It is important for you to have that constant contact with these experts.
- Study agent orange and burn pit materials. Sign in on the registries. It is important that this exposure is identified and documented.
- Schedule your yearly physical. Don't forget to share information on flashbacks, anxiety and nightmares with your doctor.
- Prepare a will.
- Share your stories. Your stories are a legacy. They can awaken future generations to their potential and provide them with a better understanding of sacrifices made.
- Participate in sendoff and welcome home events. Share those five important words – "thank you for your service." Take advantage of every opportunity to make a positive impact on others. No soldier stands alone. Assist them with transition from military to civilian life.

Combat is a team sport where no one goes it alone. Regardless of rank, branch and specialty, a service member is always a service member. We are all on the same team and we all have the camaraderie of knowing what it is life to put our lives on hold and fight for our country.

The Sioux Falls Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Health Care System has awarded a lease for a new larger site for the VA Community Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC) in Aberdeen, SD. Plans will now begin for the contractor, Construction Managers of Goldsboro, Inc., to build the new clinic at 909 S. Lamont Street behind Target in Aberdeen.

The current Aberdeen CBOC has 8,141 sq. feet; and the new clinic will add nearly 2,000 sq. feet for primary care, expanded mental health and telehealth services.

Since the VA outpatient clinic opened with contracted staff in 2001, it has continued to grow with support from Aberdeen area Veterans and surrounding communities. During FY 2017, over 2,500 Veterans received health care there.

Post Officers should look into this to verify who the registered agent is, so they know the answer when they get inspected.


Salute to Veterans
