Merry Christmas and Happy New Year

The Department Commander and his staff extend Christmas and New Year greetings to all comrades and sisters and their families. On these special days let us be thankful for the privilege of living in the United States.

1. **The State Headquarters office** will be closed on December 24th and 25th in observance of Christmas. It will also be closed on December 31st and January 1st for New Years. The Department Quartermaster will be out of the office December 18-26, 2018.

2. **Membership:** Membership efforts in December should be concentrated on contacting **ALL** 2018 members who have not paid for 2018. All unpaid members become delinquent at the end of their anniversary month. The Direct dues payment program does not eliminate the need for membership teams and committees to collect the dues of those members who have not responded to the annual notices that are mailed out by National Headquarters. Also, review the expired membership roster and start contacting them to help those “lost” members to become respectable again.

3. **Veterans Day Reports:** This report is needed from all Posts. Form may be downloaded by going on line to www.sdvfw.org. Email or mail the report to Sr. Vice Commander, Sean Johnson, 1005 N Main, Aberdeen, SD 57402. If your post has not sent in your report, please do so now.

4. **Education Teacher Award:** Winning entries at the Post level are to be submitted to the Department Chairman, prior to December 15. Each Post is encouraged to have a winner in each of the three categories, K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Post winners should be forwarded to the State Chairperson, Keith Blume, P. O. Box 215, Custer, SD 57730

5. **Voice of Democracy:** District judging should be completed by now. As soon as possible after District judging is completed, the winning essays and audio files should be sent to the State Chairperson, Keith Blume, P. O. Box 215, Custer, SD 57730. Each District will send their district winner to Pierre for the presentations of the State winners during the Legislative Conference. Plaques will be presented to the top three (3) winners at the State level.

6. **Patriots Pen:** District judging should be completed by now. As soon as possible after District judging is completed send the winning essays to the State Chairperson, Keith Blume, P. O. Box 215, Custer, SD 57730. Each District will send their district winner to Pierre for the presentations of the State winners during the Legislative Conference. Plaques will be presented to the top three (3) winners at the State level.

8. **Legislative Conference:** Council of Administration, Legislative Conference and Voice of Democracy & Patriot’s Pen Banquet has been set for January 27th & 28th, 2019 in Pierre. See enclosed notice for registration and agenda.

9. **The National Voice of Democracy** and Legislative Conference meeting will be held on March 2nd-7th, 2019 in Washington, D.C., at the Hyatt Regency Hotel, Crystal City, VA. The VOD parade of winners will take place at 6:00 pm on March 4th, 2019.

10. **Checks Sent to Department Headquarters:** All checks sent to the Department Headquarters should be made out to “**Department Of South Dakota VFW**” and marked as to what purpose each check is for. Do not make checks payable to a special account. Remember to use our **new** address **5009 W 12th Street, Suite 6A, Sioux Falls, SD 57106.**

11. **2018 By-Laws Manual & Roberts Rules of Order:** The Department recommends that all Posts purchase a new 2018 By-Laws Manual from National, and Roberts Rules from Amazon.com.

12. **Fly Flags at Half Staff on December 7th:** Public Law 103-308, passed in 1994 designates December 7, as **National Pearl Harbor Day** and all Posts should fly their flag at half-staff from sunrise to sunset.

November celebrated the nearly 5.5 million individuals who choose to care for our nation's veterans. Current estimates show nearly 2.4 million VA patients are receiving assistance with daily living activities. Those providing the assistance are mostly made up of family members such as spouses, adult children, and parents, as well as by friends and neighbors. To assure these unsung heroes are receiving the necessary support required while helping their veterans, the VFW has partnered with The Elizabeth Dole Foundation. This partnership is part of the VFW's Mental Wellness Campaign, to increase awareness of mental health options and to empower people with the knowledge to identify signs of mental distress. The VFW also worked with Congress and VA to assure the expansion of VA's current caregiver program to all eras of veterans. The expansion is expected to begin for Vietnam War era veterans in 2019. December General Orders

Christmas, the most wonderful time of the year. Time to reflect on all we are grateful for. Time to spend with those we love, those we call family, friends, and comrades. I want to wish you all the merriest of holidays from my family to yours!

Invite a service member into your home for Christmas! It is also the time of year for serving and reaching out to your community, more than we usually do.

Community Service Idea #1 – A Free Store

The idea is that you collect new and gently used clothes, or really anything else you want to include, from your church members and from donations from the community. Then, once a month or so, depending on your supply, allow people to come in and select a set number of items. There's no charge for the items, but people can only get so many per person or maybe give out bags at the entrance and each person can only take what they can fit in the bag.

Also, remember to contact local stores and ask if they have any donations. Or, better yet, local clothing manufacturers. Many factories end up with clothing that isn't good enough to sell, but is still perfectly good, it's just that the logo is crooked or the legs on the pants are of different lengths and the factory isn't going to pay someone to re-hem them.

Community Service Idea #2 – Shuttle Services for the Elderly and Ill

The best route is to contact places that might know of people interested in your help, such as doctors' offices, physical therapy clinics, maybe a grocery store in a part of town where a lot of elderly people live, etc.

There are plenty of people that have trouble running errands, or who need so much help that they wear their friends and family out with driving them around (just imagine what it would do to your work schedule if your spouse had to get chemo every week and you had to take them, or if your sister couldn't drive because she lost their leg in a car crash but she still needed groceries and her kids still needed to get to soccer practice). So, find areas where people like that would pass by and tell the doctors or staff working there that you would love to help and that they should feel free to give out the contact information to the church to anyone interested in scheduling a ride somewhere. That way, the doctor or the manager of the store will get to know you and can vouch for you as a safe person to rely on. Plus, they'll also have a better idea of those who really need the help.

Community Service Idea #3 – Bring Gift Baskets to the Police and Firefighters of Your City

Tons of people go feed the homeless on Thanksgiving or send thank you cards to military personnel stationed overseas who are away from loved ones, but few people remember that there are police officers who are working and risking their life while their child is having their first Christmas. When you bring them gift baskets or candy to share around the office, it means a lot.

Community Service Idea #4 – Look for People that No One Ever Thinks About Serving

Naturally, everyone is eager to do something for the kids and their family, especially during the holidays, but no one ever does anything for the doctors, nurses, and staff of the hospital. Other people that are often overlooked would be: trash collectors, case workers for child protective services or welfare, employees of a store. You can find forgotten people everywhere.

Community Service Idea #5 – Meet to Pray for Others

This could be meeting to pray for those in a ward of the hospital, or maybe meeting to ask God to show mercy to those with a court date that today, or really any form of interceding for another person's needs. This may not give a lot of publicity, but God wants to see the sick healed and sinners forgiven, so when you line your heart up with His and ask Him to do the things He wants to see happen anyway, your church will move forward, and the community will be changed.

Community Service Idea #6 – Think of What You Would Do if it Were Christmas, and Do Those Things When It's Not

It's amazing how many cool service ideas people come up with around the holidays, and most of them would be even more meaningful if you did them when serving wasn't a fashionable thing, like it is during holidays. It could be something as simple as making more of a conscious effort to smile at others (which we all try to do around Christmas, even when we are angry over the mall parking), or feeding the homeless, or donating gifts to the less fortunate.

Community Service Idea #7 – Collect School Supplies to Donate to Local Schools

This is a great way to serve because even the smallest gesture seems huge to the recipient. If you do something even as simple as befriend one teacher, you'll touch them deeply and other teachers will also take notice.

Dear Comrades, Brothers and Sisters,

Here it is December already. Our VFW year is almost half complete. I for one, find there are not enough hours in my day for projects and then get extremely tired in between them. Things will be a little easier here as the pasture renters just picked up mother's cattle. I also recently said my prayers, Oh Lord, I need a buyer for my metal shop building. Sure enough, prayers answered and will close here 1 December. I will still scrap metal and do it smaller scale from the farm and or out of the pickup. It was a good thing, as I used plenty a donation to fund the nonprofit organizations, community clubs, and high schools with metal donations. Also a good bit of God's Word with Proverbs 27:17, **"Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend."** Talk about a good in with conversation, when picking up material that clanks!

I had quite the season of renting with bringing the cattle back into the pasture and not on the other side of the fence. I told our neighbors once, "would you imagine that, one day we don't have enough bulls and the next day we got too many!" Fencing projects were easier this year as most times, the cows and the bulls could jump perfectly over the top wire. Most of the calves could just walk through and give you the LOOK, see what I can do! Our Post Junior Vice came out a few times to helped work and keep me on track. It sure made things a whole lot easier doing a little mending. I showed our Jr Vice, (Brian Snyder) my dad's ultimate key to success for cattle pasture renting, as I had the Jr Vice load a few wagon loads of sweet corn stalks and cobs from the garden patch. During the last month of renting, the garden goes a long way in feeding when the pasture gets short. The sweet corn patch here is a half an acre. Nothing goes to waste. If the deer and coons didn't get the sweet corn, the turkeys would... Dad use to talk to them all the time. One morning, before the sun came up, I accompanied Dad to the VA hospital to Sioux Falls. A guy was out at our mailbox at 5 AM. Dad asked the guy what he was doing, and the guy snapped back a bit, quiet, you will scare the turkeys. He was standing on our land and hunting on the neighbors. My dad, rolled up the window and looked at me and said, "my Goodness, those turkeys will walk right up to you." I saw this overkill of a hunter with all the gear, let alone the hunter forget how simple the principle of game living really was.

I had always planted 4 garden spots at the farm. The sweetcorn patch was special as Dad said, always plant enough. I would load up the corn thick, plant 3 different types of squash, and then there was our 100 pound

watermelon rinds. God does the growing, but always plant enough for the critters and the humanoids. Dad had another rule, 'never charge for food.' People would drive by wanting to pay, and Dad would say, help yourselves. However, our giant pumpkins were bought at the farm as people drove by, or later on, taken to the high school, and the football players carried them to the football field and the fruit was auctioned off for a fund raiser. Dad would always give the money to the school athletic fund on the pumpkins.

Dad had pheasant hunters, deer hunters, and a few turkey hunters over the years. The hunters were unique as they put the game in the freezer. The garden was a way of giving. It didn't take much to be a good giver. The wildlife would live for another season or eat real healthy and be food in the freezer. The spirit and intent is key. Dad didn't think twice.

Just as Dad fed the wildlife, there was always plenty later, freezing sweetcorn and the butternut squash for the winter dinner table. It tasted oh so good whether plain or doctored up any way you like it. Paul writes in Philippians 4: 14-16, **14 Notwithstanding ye have well done, that ye did communicate with my affliction.** **15 Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only.** **16 For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity.** Paul emphasizes that giving and receiving. The Philippian Church just did it! They didn't ask about no rule or think if it was okay or not okay.

Oh yes, a lengthy one page general order commentary from a Chaplain with a story about my VFW dad. What does it mean? Make it '*giving*' (generosity) a reaction.

It is Christmas time. All that the presents we give. Fret not at what you get (receive.) What's the attitude in giving. Do you have to think twice? Not to be mistaken with, about splurging or necessity withstanding. Oh I love to tell the STORY,How my Savior came in glory. John 3:16, **16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.** The real story of giving!!!
