Whereas, SDCL 3-13-56 offers SDRS participating employer units the opportunity to choose to add automatic enrollment provisions for the unit's employees that are hired on or after the effective date of July 1, 2009, OR that are hired on or after the date of this election, whichever may be later, to the SDRS Supplemental Retirement Plan; Whereas, Lake County understands and agrees to the following points: The decision to become an automatic enrollment unit shall be made by the elected official, the appointed official, or the governing body in charge of the unit; The unit shall become an automatic enrollment unit on July 1, 2009, or as soon as notice of the decision has been delivered in writing to the system, whichever is later; That all permanent fulltime employees hired on or after the effective date of this election shall be automatically enrolled in the SDRS-Supplemental Retirement Plan; That all new employee identification data via SDRS Form E-1 will be submitted to SDRS electronically; That twenty-five dollars per month shall be deferred to the plan from the employee's compensation, effective with the employee's first pay date; That the SRP deferral shall continue from the effective date of hire until the employee officially provides notice to the SRP of his/her election not to participate; Special Rule for Automatic Enrollees: if the employee elects not to participate in the plan within 90 days after his or her first pay date and gives notice of that election to the plan in a manner prescribed by the SDRS Board of Trustees, the deferred compensation amount and the associated gains or losses, less federal income tax withholding, shall be refunded to the automatic enrollee within 30 days of receipt of the final contribution. Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that Lake County shall elect to add the automatic enrollment provisions as provided under SDCL 3-13, Deferred Compensation Plan for Public Employees, and agrees to the terms and conditions as set forth by SDRS, with an effective date of July 1, 2009.

SUPPLEMENTAL RETIREMENT PLAN

Lake County has elected to implement the supplemental retirement plan automatic enrollment option for all its employees that are hired on or after the effective date of July 1, 2009. All regular full-time employees and over 20 hours a week hired on or after July 1, 2009, shall be automatically enrolled in the South Dakota Retirement System -Supplemental Retirement Plan (SDRS-SRP). Effective with the employee's first pay date, twenty-five dollars per month (the minimum contribution) shall be deferred to the SDRS-SRP from the employee's compensation.

The SRP deferral shall continue from the effective date of hire until the employee officially provides notice to the SRP of his/her election not to participate. After being automatically enrolled, the employee has 90 days after his or her first pay date in which to decide if he or she wants to continue contributing or opt-out of the SDRS-SRP. If the participant chooses to opt-out, he or she needs to provide written notice of that intent to the SDRS-SRP office during the initial 90 day timeframe to receive a refund of the deferred compensation amount and the associated gains or losses, less federal income tax withholding. This amount shall be refunded to the employee within 30 days of receipt of the final contribution.

After the initial 90-day employment period, the employee has the right to increase his or her contributions at any time while employed and participating in the SDRS-SRP. The employee may also change investment options at any time after the initial 90-day employment period. For more information on the SDRS-SRP, please see your Department Head.
