Competitions FAQ!

Q. WAIT! There's a Test??

A. Yep – there's a test! It's over safety, rules and parts of the gun. Don't worry, we'll be holding study sessions soon and if it's your first year or two – don't stress about it. You'll learn the information as we go along! Focus on relaxing, doing your best and having fun!

Q. What are relays?

A. Relays are the order that you shoot. Each firing point has 5 relays. There is a competitor for each relay and you take your turn shooting each position. Unlike at practice where we shoot all 4 in one hour, at a competition, you shoot one position each hour. Take the time between positions to relax, take a nap, read a book, or color a picture!

Q. What is 21 and Bull Buster?

A. When the main competition is over, we still need to wait for scoring to be completed and awards to be ready so at some matches, they pass the time with a friendly competition – we'll play it at practice some time so you know how it works! Usually competitors are randomly selected for these games.

Q. Awards? Do only the older shooters get awards?

A. Awards are broken down by age group (8-9, 10-11, 12&Up) so everyone has an opportunity to get an award in their own age group. There are also team and test awards. Here's a listing of the awards you can expect to see at a competition:

- Testing Ribbons for scores 90% or higher
- 1st-10th Place Prone (All Age Groups)
- 1st-10th Place Standing (All Age Groups)
- 1st-10th Place Sitting (All Age Groups)
- 1st-10th Place Kneeling (All Age Groups)
- 1st-10th Place Aggregate (All Age Groups)
- 1st -3rd Place Team Aggregate (All Age Groups)
- Sportsmanship Award (Club Award)
 This is the MOST IMPORTANT award!
