

Lake County 4-H Horse Project Overall High Point System

Rules

- All participants in the Horse Project are eligible for this award, regardless of club.
- A participant must show a horse at the County Horse Show to be eligible.
- Only one award will be awarded in each age bracket. In case of a tie, a 200 – word essay will be written by the participant and judged by the 4-H leaders to break the tie.

County Level Ribbon Points

- Each Participant will designate prior to the County Show which 4 events besides showmanship will count toward the overall trophy. This does not mean that a participant must go in 4 events nor does it limit the participant to 4 events.

<u>Ribbon Color</u>	<u>Showmanship</u>	<u>Other Events</u>
Purple	40	30
Blue	30	20
Red	20	10
White	10	5

- Participants are reminded the amount of time it takes to show excellent quality horsemanship in each event and that it is much better to participate in those events that they are prepared for and receive purple and blue ribbons that to participate in events that they have not practiced or their horse is not trained for and receive a white ribbon.

Quiz Bowl Team, Judging Team, Hippology

- 10 points for participation in event
- Maximum of 30 points

Static Exhibit during Achievement Days

- The member must complete another 4-H project that relates to the Horse Project at Achievement Days.
- Suggestions are, but not limited to: Safety, Veterinary Science, and Photography.
- Points for the Ribbon Color are as follow:
 - Purple: 30 points
 - Blue: 20 points
 - Red: 10 points
 - White: 5 points

Practice Sessions

- 1 point per practice; maximum of 5 points

Talks and demonstrations at regular meeting

- 5 points

Talks and demonstrations at County Show

- Points for the Ribbon Color are as follow:
 - Purple: 30 points
 - Blue: 20 points
 - Red: 10 points
 - White: 5 points

Playday

- 5 points for participating

Journal Book

- 20 points for turning in a completed record book.
