ARTIST IN RESIDENCY



The Madison Central School Educational Foundation co-sponsored an Artist in Residency for students in Holly Evans' art classes at Madison High School October 15-19. Artist Hector Curiel conducted a workshop for the art students.

"Having Hector as a guest artist in the High School art room for the week was so much fun," said Evans.

Students spent the week working on cartooning, caricatures, and watercolor. Curiel explained to the students when working with caricatures, the importance of really paying attention to the features and then exaggerating those certain features to make it into a caricature.

"I think the students really enjoyed the process because the overall goal wasn't for it to look like a realistic portrait. It was a fun way to work with drawing faces," said Evans.

Hector also brought in his own work for students to look at and explained his art process with the groups.

The Foundation applied for an Artists in Schools and Communities grant from the South Dakota Arts Council for this residency. The AISC grant funded half of the residency's expenses.



"We are in the process of applying for the AISC grant for the Elementary art students for the 2019-20 school year. Each year we rotate between the High School, Elementary, and Middle School buildings. We know these residencies are enjoyable for both the students and their teachers. They provide opportunities for exposure to professional artists, hands-on projects and so much more," says Foundation Director Renae Prostrollo.

GRANTS AWARDED TO TEACHERS



The Madison Central School Educational Foundation announced the Norm Johnson Educator Grant awards. Foundation Director, Renae Prostrollo, said, "The MCSEF encourages and rewards innovation in the classroom and provides educational and enrichment opportunities for students and staff beyond what is provided for within the school budget. Every year, we allocate more money for these grants and every year, we work hard to find additional funds so we can fund more of the requests- you keep us growing!"

The Norm Johnson Educator Enhancement Grant is for professional development opportunities for educators. The following educators received awards to help them attend professional development opportunities:

The Foundation also awarded two Performing and Fine Arts grant. **Monica Pickard** received funds to help her 5th grade Musical, Mulan, Jr. with props and costumes which will be performed on February 22nd; **Dawn Wiebers** & **Anne Elisa Brown** will be purchasing a theatre projection screen for the auditorium.

NEW ACTIVE LEARNING FUND



Our newest fund, Active Learning, has been created to help fund field trips. Field trips are recognized as important moments in learning; a shared social experience that provides the opportunity for students to encounter and explore new things. Active Learning is critical to the development of our youth, providing a learning and enrichment program outside the classroom.

Field trips are an opportunity for student-driven learning where the teaching does not come from the front of the classroom, this hands on learning is very impactful," says Foundation Board president Jennifer Gross.



CYBHER JOINS WITH FOUNDATION



A new grant program has been developed between CybHER at Dakota State University and the Madison Educational Foundation, with support from SBS Cybersecurity. CybHER grant will be a competitive mini-grant program that will support educators in Madison Elementary School and Madison Middle School. Two \$500 grants will be awarded to purchase technology, software or equipment for teachers' classrooms.

CybHER at DSU wanted to partner with the Madison Educational Foundation to play a small part in helping teachers get the technology they need.
